Report

A report was made to The Office of Student Conduct and Conflict Education (OSCCE) and you received a letter for a Notice of Incident Review Meeting (IRM).

All students have the right to be accompanied by an advisor of their choosing, or a universityprovided resource. To learn more about advisors and support persons, please see the guidebook. Students also may request supportive measures and accommodations.

Review

Students may choose to attend the Incident Review Meeting (IRM)

and respond to the allegations by the deaadline provided by the Student Conduct Specialist.

Students may also choose to provide a written statement, or not attend the IRM. If the student does not attend, a decision will be made without their input. If a student does not attend the IRM, they waive their right to a hearing during the appeal process

specialist makes a decision, based on the preponderance of the evidence standard, whether or not a policy violation occurred. If needed Student Conduct Outcomes are issued as a result of findings.

Outcome

Once findings are issued, the student will have appeal options which may include a written appeal or hearing.

Appeal

Within five (5) business days of the Incident Review Outcome, the student may request an appeal.

In instances in which a student outcome is suspension or dismissal, the student has the right to a formal hearing reviewed by a Campus Conduct Board.

A student may also submit a written appeal to an appeal officer.
